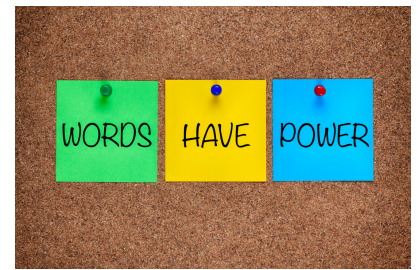


# WHICH WORDS WORK?

Workers can say things that don't always make sense! We want to do better and say things that help, and not things that get in the way.

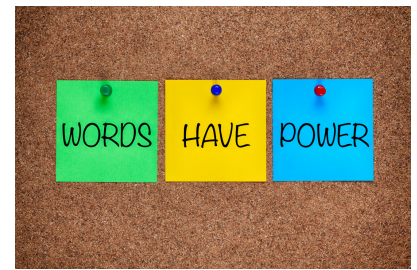
